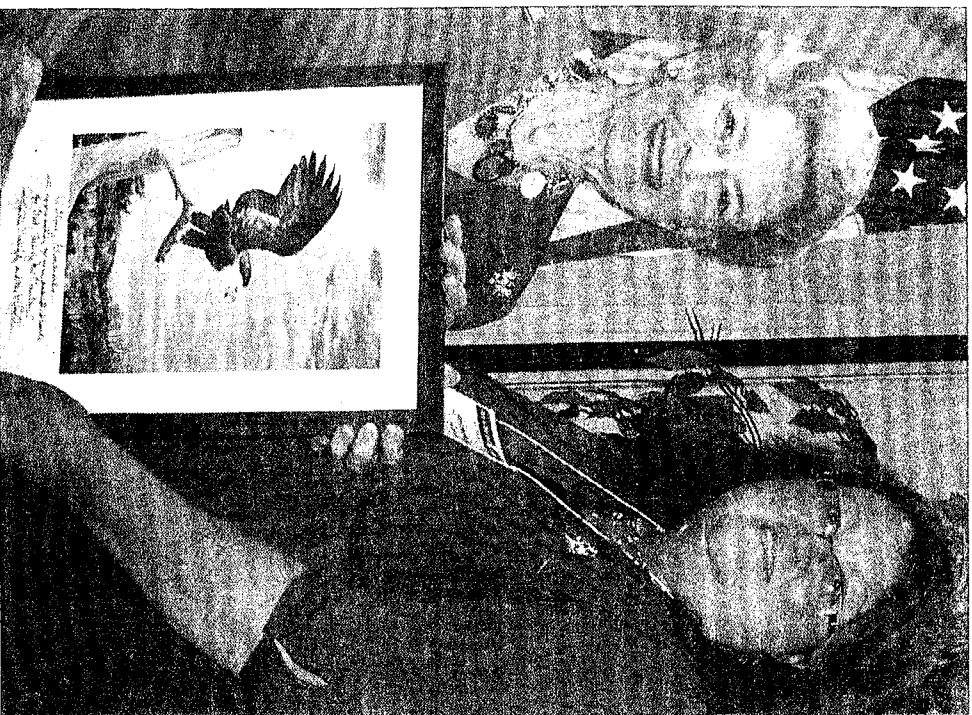
Featured speakers at the conference included Lt. Gen. Jerry Boykin, members of
